- 2015 Tax Roll Release Of Bond Received from Amy Mann, Livingston County Treasurer. The Tax Collection Report was distributed to Board members.
- □ Supervisor Pangrazio and the Board discussed a recent article about the Health Care Cadillac Tax that is set to take effect in 2018. Under the Affordable Care Act most employer-sponsored health plans with annual premiums of more than \$10,200 for individuals or \$27,500 for families would pay a 40% excise tax on the portion of the premiums that exceed those thresholds. The tax was designed to help pay for the Affordable Care Act and to help reduce health spending.
- □ Comparison of County Revenue Cap & State Spending Cap for 2016. Counties have reduced their workforce by over 9 percent since 2010, privatized numerous operations, burned through fiscal reserves to unsustainable levels, delayed maintenance and investments in critical infrastructure. The main reason for high property taxes in New York is due to the fact that New York State relies too heavily on locally raised taxes to support State initiatives and programs. New York will remain at a disadvantage compared to other states in regard to the local tax burden and its negative impact one economic opportunity and growth.

OLD BUSINESS

BUDGET DISCUSSION

Supervisor Pangrazio and the Town Board discussed the 2016 Budget and the Tax Cap. This means that Towns and other local governments have to stay within the 2 percent tax cap, or the rate of inflation (this is measured by the Department of Labor consumer price index (CPI) whichever is less. According to the numbers that Supervisor Pangrazio has received from Livingston County, the upcoming 2016 Budget will be based on a tax cap of .65%. This complicates the Town's ability to stay within the cap and still meet the taxpayers needs. If the Town is to stay within the Tax Cap, the Town would have no other choice to reduce services and employees, eliminate projects and necessary repairs to infrastructure. Based on this alone if you were to take the 2015 Budget line for line and include the proposed increases for Healthcare and NYS Retirement these costs alone would take the Town over the Tax Cap.

WATER SERVICE - LOWERY ROAD

Livingston County Water and Sewer Authority will be looking into the extension of water service to the residents on the corner of Lowery Road and Telephone Road. Livingston County is waiting for the cost estimate for construction of the extension of the water main that is currently being constructed by the Town of York. Once that information is received, Livingston County Water and Sewer will contact the residents in the area to present the information and costs involved.

It is the intent of this Local Law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Caledonia, County of Livingston pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Town of Caledonia, County of Livingston to adopt a Town Budget for the fiscal year 2016 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.

The Town of Caledonia is concerned about uncertainties in the existing Tax Cap Law, including how **uncontrollable costs** and uncertain expenditures mandated by law and uncertain expenditures and revenues controlled by the County and State interact with the Tax Cap. The Town Board is obligated to prepare a responsible budget, which meets the Town's mandated obligations and provides beneficial services, while minimizing the tax burden on the citizens of Caledonia.

THEREFORE, pursuant to statute the Town Board will hold a public hearing on said Local Law at 7:15 P.M. on Thursday, August 13, 2015 at the Caledonia Town Hall, 3109 Main Street, Caledonia, Livingston County New York, at which time and place all persons interested will be heard. A copy of the proposed Local Law is on file for public review at the Town Office of the Town of Caledonia during normal business hours.
