On motion of <u>Councilman Bickford</u> seconded by <u>Councilwoman Rychlicki</u> the resolution was ADOPTED – Aye – Pangrazio, Clark, Rychlicki, Bickford, Keenan Nay – 0 Absent – 0 RESOLVED, that the minutes of August 10, 2023 be approved.

OPEN FORUM

CLAYTON HOMES – SHAWN ADAMS

Shawn Adams of Clayton Homes introduced himself to the Board. Clayton Homes, a retailer of manufactured homes, currently has a sales center on Caledonia Avon Rd. Supervisor Pangrazio stated that because they are a Plan Unit Development (PUD), they would require Planning Board approval for many projects. Shawn stated that they have plans to make their sales center more ADA compliant.

JACOB DUNAWAY – 2511 LEROY-CALEDONIA RD

Jacob Dunaway asked the Board for an update on any progress regarding zoning changes in regards to the number of dogs allowable in the Town of Caledonia. Supervisor Pangrazio stated that Attorney Skivington was slated to attend tonight's meeting to give an update, however, was unable to attend but is working to give Mr. Dunaway an update. 7:15 P.M. – OPEN PUBLIC HEARING LOCAL LAW No. 4 FOR 2023 – TAX CAP OVERRIDE

Supervisor Pangrazio declared the Public Hearing open at 7:15 P.M. for Proposed Local Law No. 4 for 2023 and asked Town Clerk Seth Graham to read the Notice of Hearing for the record. Town Clerk Seth Graham read the Notice of Hearing. Supervisor Pangrazio asked if anyone would like to speak at this time. No one from the Board or public had any comments at this time.

SUPERVISOR PANGRAZIO – DISCUSSION ON TAX CAP OVERRIDE

Supervisor Pangrazio gave a brief overview of the Local Law. Due to uncontrollable costs and other hurdles, especially with insurance, fuel, and health care rates on the rise, Supervisor Pangrazio and the Board felt that it was in the best interest of the Town to pass this Local Law. This Local Law is to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Caledonia, County of Livingston, pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Town of Caledonia, County of Livingston, to adopt a Town Budget for the fiscal year 2024 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.
