ATTORNEY – AMY KENDALL

In Attorney Kanyuck's absence, Attorney Amy Kendall updated the Board that we are waiting for input from the Livingston County Planning Board on the Town of Caledonia's proposed Local Law for a 6-month moratorium extension.

ZONING – SUPERVISOR PANGRAZIO

In Code Enforcement Officer Tom Perkins absence, Supervisor Pangrazio updated the Board that there are two single-family homes being built on Barks Rd.

PLANNING BOARD – COUNCILWOMAN RYCHLICKI

Councilwoman Rychlicki updated the Board that the November Planning Board meeting was canceled.

BUILDINGS/GROUNDS – SUPERVISOR PANGRAZIO

Supervisor Pangrazio stated later in the meeting he would discuss designating some of the remaining ARPA funds. One of the designations is to micro-pave the parking lot behind the Town Hall, not to exceed \$7,000.

TRAFFIC SAFETY – HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT RON BEACH

Highway Superintendent Ron Beach updated the Board that there was no traffic safety meeting.

HIGHWAY – HIGHWAY SUPERINTENDENT RON BEACH

Highway Superintendent Ron Beach updated the Board on the following:

- Winter maintenance on lawnmowers and grader is being done.
- ➤ MEO Kyle Sickles passed his Class-A driver's test.
- Installed driveway pipes on McEwen Rd and an approach on Barks Rd.
- The trucks are all equipped with plow gear and have been out on salt and plow runs.
- > Jane Baker of Baker's Greenhouses donated a picnic table to the Town for the Town Park.
- Leaves are picked up in the Town Cemetery.
- We got our 1750 tonnage from Valley.
- > Ordered a new window for the shop.
- > Discussion was had regarding making some changes and expansions at the Town Transfer Station.

- The new truck should be ready sometime in early 2025. A referendum will be needed to purchase the equipment.
- Discussion was had regarding the purchase of a new mower. Highway Superintendent Ron Beach handed out quotes to the Board. The Board discussed and per Ron's recommendation, they would like to proceed with the purchase of a John Deere 6M105 which will cost (after a \$61,000 trade-in) approximately \$84,932.07.
- Future projects include winter maintenance on mower, roller and shoulder machine, tree trimming on Sand Hill Rd and installing the new window at the shop.

DISCUSSION – 2025 TOWN RULES & REGULATIONS

Supervisor Pangrazio handed out the 2025 Non-Highway and Highway Rules & Regulations for the Board to review. Supervisor Pangrazio stated there was a small change that when hiring Highway employees, preference will be given to Caledonia residents, however, with the difficulty finding people the Board will expand to a 7-mile radius for hiring for Highway positions. Supervisor Pangrazio discussed with the Board the purchase of a new 10-wheeler. The old truck will be auctioned off and the funds will be appropriated to the purchase of the new 10-wheeler to offset the cost.

DISCUSSION – PURCHASE OF TRACTOR

Supervisor Pangrazio discussed with the Board the purchase of a new tractor. Per Highway Superintendent Ron Beach's recommendation, the Board is interested in trading in both tractors for approximately \$61,000 and purchasing a John Deere 6M105 for an estimated \$84,932.07 after trade in of our 2007 John Deere 6415 with a side and rear mower and our 2017 John Deere 5075M.

DISCUSSION – DESIGNATING ARPA FUNDS

Supervisor Pangrazio discussed with the Board allocating the remaining ARPA funds to be used at either the Transfer Station or the Town Park. Supervisor Pangrazio will designate the funds at the December 30th end of year meeting and would like Highway Superintendent Ron Beach to gather some numbers for some upgrades and projects at the Transfer Station or Park.

PURCHASE OF 10-WHEELER

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Town Board of the Town of Caledonia in the County of Livingston, State of New York, at a regular meeting that was held on the 12th day of December 2024, duly adopted, subject to a permissive referendum, a resolution as follows:

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Caledonia has determined that it is necessary to upgrade equipment at the Highway Garage.

WHEREAS, the Town received a quote from Tracy Road Equipment and Viking Cives USA in the amount of \$280,490.94 before a trade in of a 2006 Sterling.

WHEREAS, the Board agreed to accept the quote of \$280,490.94 from Tracy Road Equipment and Viking Cives USA for the purchase of a 2025 Western Star 47x 10-wheeler.

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the cost of the equipment to not exceed \$280,490.94.

WHEREAS, in recognition of this need to upgrade this piece of equipment, funds for such purpose are in the TOWN OF CALEDONIA EQUIPMENT Capital Reserve Fund; and,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Board authorizes the Supervisor to expend from the Capital Reserve Fund the funds necessary to purchase this Excavator.

Said resolution shall take effect thirty days after adoption, unless there shall be filed with the Town Clerk a petition signed and acknowledged by the electors of the Town qualified to vote upon a proposition to raise and expend money, in number equal to at least five percentum of the total vote cast for governor in the Town at the last general election held for the election of State officers protesting against the resolution and requesting that the matter be submitted to the qualified electors of the Town at a referendum in the manner provided by Town Law.

This resolution shall be subject to a permissive referendum, as permitted by law.
